
St. Augustine (m)

- Lived around the 4th and 5th century in present-day Algeria
- Patron Saint of brewers, printers and theologians
- Born to Monica (who eventually became St. Monica) and an unnamed pagan father, who later converted to Christ.
- Education was always stressed in the household, especially a classical education, but Christianity was suppressed by the abusive father
- Author of *Confessions*, his part autobiographical, part philosophical work outlining his personal spiritual journey as well as his reasons for making the choices he made and believing the things he now believes.
- Author of *City of God*, a book describing the relationship of the Christian religion (the only one at the time) with other religions. It is part history, part philosophy



- Heavy philosophical influence of St. Thomas Aguinas
- After his, now famous, conversion that he became Bishop of Hippo (present-day Algeria).
- He is one of the Catholic Church's first ever declared Doctors (Teachers) of the Church.
- Feast Day: August 28th
